POLICY OF RESPONSIBLE USAGE OF RAW MATERIALS





Company Artweld is aware of its shared responsibility for usage of raw materials including so-called conflict minerals. These minerals are being used to directly or indirectly finance armed military conflicts in several countries in the Great Lakes region of Central Africa.

We commit to make effort to ensure that the products in our offer do not contain conflict minerals, namely: tin, tantalum, tungsten and gold mined in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and adjacent countries as well.

The aim of this policy is our wish to contribute to support of conflict-free sourcing of raw materials and conflict-free supply chains.

We intend to comply with requirements stated in § 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Act by conducting a proper inspection of the sources of these minerals and sharing its results.



Our suppliers are requied to

- Conduct an inspection of their supply chains to determine whether the products they sell to us contain tin, tantalum, tungsten or gold, and if so, whether these metals are obtained from a conflict-free smelter
- Report to us on the results of this inspection so that we can meet our ethical commitments and objectives
- To prefer cooperation with conflict-free smelters in their business activities
